Welcome

Welcome back everyone. We are very excited to see our Ducklings return after a rather strange and somewhat unusual summer break. Arrival information

Please can all adults sanitise their hands using the sanitiser provided before entering the nursery. We will only be allowing one adult and one child into the cloakroom at a time and we would encourage social distancing when waiting on the ramp. Once in the nursery the children will say goodbye and go straight into the bathroom to wash their hands and parents will leave the nursery via the back door. Please could we request that you leave the playground as quickly as possible? We appreciate this may take some time to get all the children into the nursery safely but hope you will support us during this time.

Self-registration

The children will continue to self-register however this is a little different to before. Their nametags will in a basket on the table at the bottom of the ramp. The children will find their name and then hook them onto our new train track tree by the front door. Each group has a designated area in the cloakroom for the children to hang their coats. Duckling backpacks will continue to be hung on the hooks on the handrail along the ramp.

Lunch boxes

There are now four large plastic boxes one for each group which the children can pop their lunchboxes in.

Water Bottles

We would now like all children to have their own water bottles in nursery. We will continue to provide snack but the children will have their water bottles rather than milk or water in cups. There will be a designated place to store the bottles, and the children will be able to access them throughout the day.

Wellies and slippers

Please can I remind you that all children will need wellies and slippers to keep at nursery? During the first couple of weeks, fingers crossed the weather stays fine the children will keep their shoes on. Once everyone has settled into nursery life we will introduce slippers and wellies.

Toys/comforters

Please can we request that the children do not bring any toys or books into the nursery? We are very happy for them to bring in comforters during their settling in period.

Water bottles, lunch boxes, wellies, slippers, clothing and shoes should be clearly named.

We will be doing our very best to keep the children, their families and staff safe and well during the coming months but it goes without saying that we all must remain vigilant in the current situation.

Duckling changes

During the last five months we had to make many changes in Ducklings and one was the way in which the children were grouped in their bubbles. These consisted of mixed ages and we recognised how our oldest and youngest Ducklings benefited from these groupings. The older children were so caring, kind and responsible for the younger ones and subsequently the younger Ducklings learnt so much from the older children.
