Covid update

Please can I remind you that the guidance from the DfE remains the same and if your child has covid symptoms, has a positive test or is required to isolate they cannot attend nursery. Children under 18 and those people fully vaccinated do not now need to isolate if they have been in close contact with a positive case including a household family member. The nursery will continue to be vigilant in order to protect children and staff from possible infection. We have been quiet the past few weeks as we have had many children with very nasty coughs and colds, as well as a sickness bug and chicken pox who have been unable to attend. Due to the past eighteen months the children's resistance to infection appears to be very low. Fingers crossed they will all begin to build up their immunity very soon. Reminders
